The Parables of Jesus

Wednesday 7:15 a.m. Prayer Chapel Teacher: Pastor Seth

Teaching by parables was a primary method Jesus used to describe God and the ways of God. The Greek word for parable, "parabole," literally means to, "throw together." Jesus "threw together" common, everyday events of his culture; family life, agriculture, trade and commerce, politics, and socio-economic realities, with theological truths and principles concerning God and God's people. Jesus' parables sometimes comforted and sometimes confounded. Today we might say that Jesus' parables challenged the prevailing worldview of that day. In fact, they still do!

The parables of Jesus fall roughly into three categories: Parables of Grace; Parables of the Kingdom; and Parables of Judgment. No matter what "type" of parable, the message was clear: God has a plan for the world and for the people who live in God's world. Join us as we explore the parables of Jesus and how these timely stories address timeless principles!
